

Our Annual Impact



KVC Missouri is a private, nonprofit organization that strengthens families, prevents child abuse and neglect, and helps people achieve mental health wellness. Our flagship location, KVC Niles in Kansas City, has a nearly 140-year legacy as it was founded when Samuel Eason began caring for homeless children in 1883. The historic nonprofit became part of KVC Health Systems in 2017. KVC Missouri's services now include family strengthening prevention, day treatment (K-12 school), children's behavioral health services ranging from intensive outpatient to residential treatment, treatment foster care, foster parent training, and other community-based services for families.
